About Bee-ology



My name is Poppy, I play the role of a biologist.

I am a circus performer, I do juggling, dance and theatre in the show. I am the only performer.



The show is a celebration of bees and their dance language

In the same way that bees use movement to communicate important messages, I do too in the show.



I speak directly to the audience and you can participate if you like.

I will also ask some questions, you can answer if you like, but you don't have to.

Scene by scene



First I will introduce myself.

I will also ask how you are.



I have a basket of strawberries.

Depending on Covid Regulations, I may offer you a strawberry.



I have a hose pipe and I get tangled in it.

It represents how humans and nature are entangled with each other.



The plant on my head is an orchid.

Their flowers have evolved to attract pollinators.

I water the plant while it balances on my head.



These are juggling clubs, we need each other to do juggling.

I will first juggle and talk and then I will juggle to music.



The waggle dance is a way that bees tell each other where things are.

I sing and dance a song about it and then I teach the dance to the audience, you can join in if you like.



I will then juggle with balls and with jars of honey.

This time there is music and words.

I talk about the juggling and how
my body knows where to catch and
throw




There is something special to show the audience.

At the end of the show I blow bubbles and ask what they have in common with bees, you can guess if you like.


After the show
