**All performances of WILD are similar to relaxed performances.**

You can:

- wear headphones
- talk to each other or make noises
- come and go
- move around



**All ages**

**Wild is a dance-circus show.**

It is suitable for all ages!



**It may be busy**

**Wild is an outdoor performance.**

It may be busy and noisy at the event. There will be staff around the site to direct you and to keep everyone safe.



**45 Minute show**

**Wild is 45 minutes long.**

The show has no flashing lights. There is music playing all the way through. There are times when the performers will talk. There will be times when people will clap. You do not have to join in with the clapping if you do not want to.

# Wild: Content and trigger warnings



There are traffic noises and a car horn sound at the start of the show.



Sometimes the performers will talk directly to the audience, but there is no audience participation. You do not need to reply to questions and will not be asked to enter the performance space.



The performers climb the tall poles. They stand on top of the poles. Don't worry, they have had a lot of practice! The performers will drop from the poles. It can look scary but don't worry, they are okay!



During the show, the performers will throw bags around. Sometimes they pretend to throw them into the audience but don't worry, they won't!
