About Sliding Slope



Sliding Slope is a dance performance about global warming and flooding.



The performance will happen on a roof of a house.

The house will be underwater, and the roof will be above water.



Performers will dance on the roof.

It might look dangerous but the performers will be safe.

The performers may seem distressed but they are okay.



Audiences will stand around the performance area, on land.



What happens in the show



Four performers will be on the roof when the dance begins.



The performers stand, sit and move on the roof.



They fight over a plant.



And someone throws it in the water.



They talk about the idea of home.



We hear a voiceover of a woman who survived a flood.



One person jumps from the roof



Two performers fall into the water and swim to the shore.





Last performer jumps into the water

Then, the performance will end.
