About: Are You Here For The Meeting?



A unique meeting experience that has been put together by young performers aged 15 to 24, for up to 60 audience members.



Contains themes surrounding the burdens that young people carry, yet the joy and hope they offer.



You'll encounter an area which is 15m x 18m within which there is a disarray of 80 chairs facing different directions. There is a school vault which acts as a podium, which signals the 'front'.




The show is a chaotic and unusual meeting, which involves movement, song, speech and performers moving through and close to audience.


What happens in the show



The show begins inside the cordoned performance space with one dancer at podium, who is eventually joined by all the dancers.



The performers will invite the audience into the cordoned area. They sit with the audience, address the audience, individually and in groups. They will also stand on chairs, move chairs, and execute fast movements from time to time.



They wear typical clothes and have handheld amps and microphones, which they will use to speak and make sounds.





They will dance alone and in pairs, in a group, and within the audience.
